

MOUNTAIN VISTA GOLF COURSE

LOCAL RULES

1. All water hazards and culverts are considered lateral hazards (i.e. red lines). (Appendix I, A.1.)
2. Stones in bunkers are considered moveable obstructions. (Appendix I, A.3.f.)
3. A ball lying within two club-lengths of a sprinkler head within two club-lengths of a green interfering with line of play may take relief. (Appendix I, A.4.a.)
4. A free drop (one club-length) from flower beds (annuals) MUST be taken. (Appendix I, 2.a.)
5. In the absence of red lines defining a hazard, bushes adjacent to water and lateral water hazards are considered to be part of the hazard. (Appendix I, A.1.)
6. Drop areas on Santa Rosa Hole #12 and San Gorgonio Hole #17 are options for a player whose ball has entered the lateral water hazard. (Appendix I, A.6.)
7. A 150-yard tree is an integral part of the course and no relief is given, unless it is “staked” and the stake interferes with a player’s stance or swing. (Appendix I, 1.)
8. All paved roads are considered to be “boundary lines” and a ball crossing them is out of bounds. (Appendix I, 1.) A ball which crosses a public road defined as out of bounds and comes to rest beyond that road is out of bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the course. (Decision 27-20.)
